The Beginner and Intermediate Classes were completely full with twelve students in each. This year we have four paid instructors and four volunteer instructors with a combined 65 years of sailing experience!



Our Beginner Class began their practice in Hunter 140s and quickly transitioned over to Optis. Once in the Optis, they were able to master their own vessel with an instructor in a nearby motorboat. With the energy and enthusiasm this class brought every morning, they were able to learn all of the basic sailing skills such as tacking and jibing, points of sail, and right of way within the

first three days and put it all together by the fourth day.

In the Intermediate Class, the students applied what they learned from the Beginner Class. Taking to Hunters, Optis, or 420s, they practiced tacking and jibing on the whistle, man overboard drills, and

trimming their sails for sailing upwind. With so many skills under their belts, most of the competitive spirits were unphased by the windy afternoon late in the week. Even after that gusty encounter, the 420s were the group's favorite type of boat, so we think it is safe to say, "Racing, here they come!"





Despite the rain and following glassy smooth water, Friday still turned out to be a "Fun Friday." After land games, including a version of Duck, Duck, Goose that included typing knots, Capture the Flag, and Sailing Jeopardy, the ice cream social and awards was a big hit, as always. Then, in the afternoon, while the lack of wind prevented the Intermediates from sailing right away, we all learned and practiced how to row a dinghy. Our first ever dinghy relay race took place with lots of cheering and laughs.

Saturday's Pancake Breakfast was a huge success with a total of 185 people that attended. There were many great items to bid on at the Silent Auction as well as a beautiful raffle basket. With an intense competition of pancake makers (primarily the staff) in the classroom and on the porch, fun was had by all.
