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Lecture Series Grows

The OBYC lecture series has attracted large crowds this summer for a smorgasbord of subjects. The final lecture, Thursday, Aug. 25, will feature Ed Phinney lecturing on the history of our area.

Lecture goers have learned numerous facts.

Civil War reenactor, Thornton Batty explained why soldiers preferred a minimum number of brass buttons on their uniforms: the buttons tarnished easily and required constant polishing. He also revealed the layers of clothing worn by Civil War soldiers from the Maine regiment. He capped off the lecture by playing songs of the era on his banjo.

Ornithologist Derek Lovitch lectured on "Birds on the Local Maine Coast."
He said he has identified 175 different species of birds in our area over the years, including ones which had apparently become confused and aren't supposed to be migrating our way.

Mt. Everest climber Ed Webster told the tale of his harrowing climb of Mt. Everest with three other men who summited without bottled oxygen, a radio or a Sherpa guide. Along with his slide show, he brought some of the equipment he had used
