In addition to the Blessing, we had our first lecture recently by Lew Incze. Lew has a PhD in Fisheries and Aquatic Sciences from the University of Washington. He is an Oceanographer and Marine Ecologist and has been a Research Scientist and Professor in these and other areas. Lew's presentation included data, science and perspectives regarding Climate Change based upon extensive knowledge and research in which he has been and continues to be involved. He included a brief discussion of the effects of warming on our own Gulf of Maine. The discussion was thoughtful and focused, and there was plenty of time after the lecture for discussion and questions.

The Social Committee is planning additional select events for the remainder of the season. Keep an eye out for E-Blasts announcing events and details.

There is one safety item I would like to mention: We are asking members who keep their dinghies at the Club to avoid tying off in the last 5-6 feet at the south end of the floats. OBYC has unwittingly been committing light pollution and has taken steps to reduce it.

The Club pier has long featured a floodlight that comes on at dusk and illuminates the docks for nighttime visitors' convenience and safety.

But, unnoticed by club members, the light shone brightly across Merriconeag Sound. In June, the Club received a polite letter from a resident of a house across the water asking whether the club could reduce the visual impact.

Moored in Stover's Cove one evening, Paul and Kym Cournoyer and Dick and Gail Stevens confirmed the problem. Since then, Paul and Dick have replaced the light with an energy-efficient LED light that limits the glow to the docks where it is needed.

In another development, the aged coupling between floats Three and Four became detached. Since one of the floats is scheduled to be replaced this winter, the waterfront committee decided to reattach it and reinforce the link with a hefty rope between the two floats rather than undertaking a major overhaul during the summer.

Paul Plummer, Harpswell Harbormaster, has informed the club he will be installing two "No Wake" buoys along the west side of the Club's anchorage area. He plans to enforce the rule once the buoys are in place. This is good news for club boaters since it should reduce rocking for boats tied to the floats.
