### July 2022

With summer weather finally upon us, the mooring field is beginning to fill and the dinghy dock is becoming more crowded. The 2022 season is off to a great start thanks to the efforts of our many volunteers on the waterfront and building and grounds committees.

Thanks to the hard work of the Social Committee many members have already participated in the welcome back social hour on June 11, the blessing of the fleet offered by the Reverend Kitty Babson on June 25, and the AFSS Pancake Breakfast on July 2. # Sailing School Opens

*by Sue Baker* The Abbot Fletcher Sailing School celebrated 22 years of teaching young sailors as it began classes on July 4 following a highly successful Pancake Breakfast.

The Sailing School is operating near full capacity with 81 registrations for the six-week session. They include 46 Beginner, 29 Intermediate, and 6 Racing students. Several of the classes reached maximum capacity of 10 students by mid-April this year.

The sailing school is named for one of the club's founding members, a noted waterman who sailed in countless ocean-sailing races. It is largely funded by tuition and fund-raising. It is an important part of the club's mission of instilling knowledge of *cont. pg. 4*

international potluck dinner on July 9, and family day on July 23, have been scheduled.

Water continues to be a concern at the club this summer. The average precipitation in the Portland area for the first six months of the year is 23.13", but this year we have only received 18.5", leaving us 20% below the annual average. The club has installed hardware and software to help us monitor our water usage, and to determine if there is a leak, a running faucet or toilet, etc., in the clubhouse.

In an effort to conserve water we ask members and their guests to consider using the porta-potty by the back door. Please don't wash down boats at the dock.

After many years of dedicated service Dick Stevens stepped down as chair of the building and grounds committee this spring.

Fortunately several club members have stepped up and offered to take on the many duties necessary to keep the club operating. Paul Kittle volunteered to make sure that the club's fire extinguishers have been tested and are ready for use, and to oversee the decommissioning of the water filtration system at the end of the year. Tom Jackman has assumed responsibility for working with Dead River to assure we have gas at the dock throughout the summer. Teena Patton and Bill Snellings have agreed to assume responsibility for monitoring propane supply and the trash pickup, respectively.

Max Fletcher and Lynnie Bruce volunteered to do the water-quality testing and Fred Holler now monitors water usage. Dan Stevens has offered to help out whenever needed, and Tim Vail continues to help throughout the season.

The club still, however, needs someone to serve as the chair, or possibly co-chair, of the building and grounds committee. This position would largely entail coordinating with the other members of the committee to insure that all of the necessary work has been completed. If anyone is interested in serving as the chair or co-chair of this committee please let me know.

sailing in new generations. It also enhances OBYC-Community relations, since many local children who aren't related to members learn to sail here.

During class sessions – weekdays during July and early August – the sailing school uses the two north floats and the "U" where dinghies are normally stored. Club members bringing boats to the docks for loading or fuelling should avoid the area and give-way to all the young sailors as they maneuver the Optis they use to learn in. A member of the AFSS committee is always at the club while classes are going on.

Erin Kenyon has returned for her fourth year as Head Instructor. The staff includes seasoned instructors Christopher Fletcher and Mitch Lienert as well as Karl Kreuze who joins as a paid instructor after being a volunteer for the past two summers. Chloe Filipowicz returns as a volunteer for the month of July.

Because of continued concerns about covid, classes again are being taught outside under the tents rather than in the small classroom in the clubhouse.

The pancake breakfast fundraiser returned on July 2 after a 2-year hiatus due to covid. Prepared, cooked, and served by the instructors and members of the Sailing Committee (plus a few additional supporters of the program), approximately \$1,600 was raised. On July 9 the second online silent auction will be held on Zoom from 10 AM to noon.
