# Waterfront Readied for Summer

The OBYC floats are in the water and already in use. Families will venture out on sail boats and power boats. Kayakers will paddle off into the sunset. AFSS students will hone their newly obtained sailing skills.

Well before the waterfront is commissioned for the season, a lot of work takes place. On Saturday April 29th, a group of club members volunteered to make repairs to our floats. Led by Bob Gill, several volunteers replaced decayed deck planking on one of the AFSS floats. Ed Kenyon, Erin Kenyon, Nick Nichols, Ben Skinner and George **Kinser** all worked to repair the float so it's safe for AFSS students this summer. Eric Lusk power washed the barnacles off the sides of several floats.

Meanwhile, Kurt Miller, Bruce MacLeod and Waterfront and Anchorage chair, Paul Cournoyer replaced a rusted out mushroom mooring that holds the kayak float in place. Luckily, Waterfront

Committee member Diane Winchell had recently donated a mushroom mooring, avoiding the need to buy a new one.

All of this effort culminated on May 6th. A large crowd of volunteers arrived. The club floats were returned to the water by a giant crane and then securely put into place on their moorings. So many club members came out on a misty, raw Saturday to lend a hand in this Spring club ritual that the work was finished in less than three hours!

Hilary Henry, who's been providing the coffee and donuts for several years for each Spring and Fall float evolution, said: "this is the largest group of volunteers for this event - next time I'm getting four boxes of coffee and four dozen donuts!."

More volunteers will be needed Saturday, June 17 at 9 a.m. to get the sailing-school boats and equipment in position for use by the AFSS. And come Saturday, October 14th we'll need more volunteers when the floats are pulled out and stacked.

The volunteer Day Steward program will resume Wednesday, July 5. Rich and Bunny Siegel, who spearheaded the successful resumption of the program last year, hope to get 25 to 30 member volunteers to provide coverage on weekdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. So far 19 people have volunteered.

The Siegels will run a class Monday, June 19 at 7 p.m. to cover Steward duties and skills such as operating the marine radio, rowing around the mooring field to eyeball boats and pointing out guest moorings to visitors. Even returning stewards are required to attend the class.

The goal of the program is to welcome visitors, help members dock and cast off from the floats, and keep an eye out for trespassers using the facilities. Rich Siegel said that last summer "The program was well received by members and guests. We covered about 75% of the available days."

Sign up can be via phone or email, or via an internet sign-up sheet as in past years. Other pertinent info will be discussed at the orientation session.

With this robust response, day stewards should be able to cover all of the days in July and August, with folks just taking 2 days each.
