In response to numerous comments at the two most recent Annual Meetings, several Board Members have been working with the town and legal counsel in a series of meetings supported by fact-finding to understand limitations on our membership. As a result and consistent with the defined responsibilities of the Board, we recently voted to change the membership rule to increase the membership from 250 to 260 regular members, effective immediately. *continued*, *Pg*. 2


I look forward to seeing everyone on the water or at one of our upcoming social events.

Long-time OBYC member Wendy Burns died May 11 at age 73. She had been diagnosed with Multiple System Atrophy, a degenerative neurological disorder, in early 2018.

Wendy, who spent summers at a home on Orrs Island with her husband, Bill, had lived in the Washington, D.C. area for most of her adult life. She worked for 33 years as a speech and language pathologist in the Fairfax County school system. She specialized in helping students overcome stuttering. She was active in numerous organizations, including her church, a tennis club, book club and bridge club. She was also involved in Democratic Party politics and supported many environmental causes.

In Harpswell, she and Bill were active sailors in their Flying Scot and participated in local sailing races. She was an active participant in many social activities at OBYC including Bingo nights.

She is survived by her husband, Bill and three adult children: twins, Eric and Laura and son Greg.
