Day Stewards Program Resumes

The volunteer Day Steward program will resume after July 4 this summer. Rich and Bunny Siegel, who spearheaded the successful resumption of the program last year, hope to get 25 to 30 member volunteers to provide coverage on weekdays from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m.

Sailing School Sets Sails for Summer

The Abbot Fletcher Sailing School is setting sail for summer with a reduced but carefully focused sailing curriculum and staffing plan.

The club's AFSS committee expects the new school design will appeal to many young sailors, and it hopes to attract children and grandchildren of members. The new schedule of two-week courses permits learners to sign up for the first week only.

The racing program, which required a three-week, all day commitment, has been eliminated, although some race training will continue.

Last fall an ad hoc Sailing Committee appointed by Commodore Garrett Knight studied the future goals of AFSS, reviewing the roots of OBYC's sailing program and concentrating on how to model the program in the future.

Because of slumping attendance, tuition payments weren't covering the cost of running the program. Attendance has declined in recent years largely because a smaller percentage of members have young children to enroll in the program. Outside enrollees haven't made up the difference.

As a result, AFSS is revamping its summer sailing program in 2016. Three 2-week sessions will be offered for beginner and Intermediate sailors. AFSS is eliminating the 3-week, all-day sessions for Opti and 420 Racing.

Optimal class size will be 10 students. All instructors will be US Sailing Level 1 certified, with the Head Instructor Level 2 certified. Instructors will include Chelsea Hartnett and Augie Lienert, who are both both taking Level I U.S. Sailing courses this spring. Both have been volunteers in past years . Each has been with AFSS since the age of 9.

The Sailing Committee, headed by Bobbi Robertson, chair and Sue Baker and Bob Gill, Vice Chairs, expanded its membership, and a member will be assigned to be at the club as a monitor whenever an AFSS class is in session. The committee added that "We thank Ned Kitchel for leading AFSS the past three seasons."

The Beginner class, starting in the morning, will provide the basic knowledge of sailing using the club's Hunter sailboats. These boats will always have an instructor on board to guide the students. As the sailor progresses, the Opti's will be introduced as the student gains the confidence to be in an Opti or a 420 and he/she can advance to the afternoon Intermediate sessions.

The school will have the markers set up to learn racing skills, but the emphasis will be a skill-based program. This will prepare any student to enter a full-time racing program or be a part of our non-competitive team should they have a desire to do so.

Students are encouraged to take advantage of one of the three 2-week sessions. But, because some may not be able to commit to that timeframe, a student enrolling in AFSS for the first time may register for the *first* week of a 2-week session. For those who have taken a one-week Beginner class at AFSS previously, we will accept registrations for the *second* week of a 2-week session.

Information about the 2016 AFSS schedule and enrollment application can be found on the OBYC website (www.obyc.org). We encourage all OBYC members to consider enrolling members of their family (children, grandchildren, nieces & nephews). OBYC members receive a discounted tuition.
