### New This Year – Dinghy/Kayak Permit Stickers

To improve the traceability of members' dinghies at the floats and kayaks stored on the racks, dinghy/kayak registration stickers will be sent to all members who have paid their dinghy/kayak fee for this year. Those members will receive their sticker later this month.

Dinghies that are stored in the water are to have their sticker placed on the inside of the transom on either the port or starboard side of the transom. Dinghies that are stored on top of the floats are to have their sticker placed on the outside of the transom in a visible manner. All kayaks stored on the club racks must have the sticker affixed to the right side of the kayak bow.

In addition, please remember to mark your name and phone number on your dinghy or kayak with a permanent ink marker.

### Exercise Classes Offered

We are fortunate to have Instructors Kevin Wicks and Heather Preston-Weeks return to OBYC for another summer season of exercise classes! Please plan to arrive 5-10 minutes early to complete appropriate paperwork!

Kevin will offer **YOGA** classes every Mon-Wed-Fri morning, June 25 through September 21, @ 7:30-8:30 am. All classes are on a "drop-in" basis and donations are accepted. Classes start promptly at 7:30 am. Please bring a mat!

Heather is offering a new "trial" **WALK15**® aerobic class on Tues, June 26 and Thurs, June 28 @ 7:30-8:00 am. Participants may walk 1, 2, or 3 miles in a group setting, using the proven techniques of the *Walk at Home* program. With just <u>four basic</u> steps, participants get a heart-pumping, calorie-torching aerobic workout. This is a multi-muscle multi-directional walk. Each session begins with a warm-up to prepare the body for more intense exercise, and a cool-down to safely bring the heart rate and breathing back to normal for an overall safe workout. Fee: \$8.00 per class

During the months of July and August, Heather will offer her **GENTLE AEROBICS** classes every Tues and Thurs @ 7:30-8:15 am. This moderately-paced aerobics class combines cardio, balance, and strength to give you a full-body workout in a safe and gentle format. A chair is utilized for most of the workout and is always there to lend support whenever needed. Resistance bands and balls are used to increase strength and muscle definition, and a final cool down and stretch incorporates gentle yoga modifications using the chair. (We do not get on the floor at any time during this class.) Fee: July and Aug Sessions include 9 classes for \$72 each, or \$10 walk-in fee per class.

# *Thursday Lectures: From Starfish to Coffees*

OBYC Member Joan Lester has put together another outstanding line-up for the **2018 Thursday Lectures Series**. Every other Thursday evening at 6:30 pm members share dessert and coffee (or tea) and meet our speaker. The presentations start at 7:00 pm.

Lecture #1, on June 28, "From Bailey Island to the Barrier Reef: Sea Stars as Sentinels of a Changing World". For more than a decade, Dr. Jon Allen of Bowdoin's Schiller Coastal Studies Center on Orr's Island and his students have been exploring the coast of Maine, studying the ecology, evolution and developmental biology of its unique animals. In that time much has changed in our understanding of how changes in temperature, salinity and acidity can affect animal ecology. In this talk, Dr. Allen will focus on the echinoderm fauna found on Bailey Island (sea stars, sea urchins and sand dollars) and how lessons learned from the Gulf of Maine have led to important discoveries around the world.

**Lecture #2**, on July 12, *"Harriet Beecher Stowe: The Little Lady Who Started That Great War"* will be presented by Cathi Belcher, Stowe House Educator of Bowdoin College. She will examine the background, life and family of Harriet Beecher Stowe, and the personal events which led up to the writing of her most famous book, <u>Uncle Tom's Cabin</u>. After a brief synopsis of the book, we'll look at various African-American men and women with whom Stowe had contact, and who influenced her writing. Ms. Belcher offers monthly lectures at the Stowe House in Brunswick and serves Harriet's favorite drink, tea. We will do the same this evening!

Lecture #3, on July 26, "*Reflections of My Journey From Maine to Africa and Haiti as a US Diplomat*". Former US Ambassador and Orr's Island resident Pamela White will cover her forty plus years as a diplomat in the United States Foreign Service, and the lessons she learned along the way. She will begin with her Peace Corps experience in a tiny village in Cameroon where she taught English and will end with her US ambassadorship to Haiti. She will give insights into her relationships with people – from villagers to Presidents (US, African and Haitian) – and some amusing anecdotes about them all!

Lecture #4, on Aug 9, "Let's Talk Coffee!" Founder of Wicked Joe Organic Coffee Co. and Orr's Island resident Bob Garver will be speaking on the creation of the business, interaction with worldwide coffee farmers, and current innovations of the family-owned sustainablecoffee company. Their organic certified roastery in Topsham is a state-of-the-art and energyefficient facility. Bob works directly with farmers and cooperatives to build lasting, collaborative partnerships. Come hear all about "green" coffee! We will be serving Wicked Joe coffee before the gathering.

### Erin Kenyon Named Head Instructor for 2018

OBYC Junior Associate Member Erin Kenyon will be Head Instructor at the Abbot Fletcher Sailing School for 2018. She is returning to the program after having worked as Mate on the *Schooner Alert* for several summers.

Erin, a fourth grade school-teacher in Maine, previously taught at AFSS for seven seasons; two as a beginner and intermediate instructor, and five as the head racing instructor of the Club 420 boats. Erin is US Sailing Level 3 certified.

Erin discovered her passion for teaching as a young sailing instructor at AFSS. She recently purchased a 1964 Marshall Sanderling Catboat that she keeps moored at OBYC.
