Winter Work Prepared Waterfront

It was a gloomy, raw day at OBYC on April 13th, but Club volunteers eagerly anticipated another great season by getting ready.

The Waterfront and Anchorage, Building and Grounds and AFSS Committees were already hard at work sprucing up the waterfront and clubhouse. Floats were repaired and club dinghy bottoms were painted. New LL Bean rocking chairs were purchased over the winter. They have been assembled, and they are ready for members to relax in on the porch this summer. This was a true example of the volunteerism of our club members.

Over the winter the club obtained a condition assessment of our main floats and pier. Our pier was found to be in great shape for many more years to come. However, three of our main floats needed to be replaced due to the degradation of the fasteners holding them together. More than 20 years of sitting in salt water and the stress of being lifted with a crane twice a year has taken its toll. As a result, the Board of Directors approved the purchase of three new floats using building reserve funds. The floats are currently under construction at Redfish Marine in Cundy's Harbor. Over the next several years the Waterfront and Anchorage Committee will continue to assess our waterfront infrastructure and make recommendations to the Board as necessary.

Our goal is to make the OBYC waterfront safe and long lasting for present and future generations of members to enjoy.

Dinghy bottoms are painted.

A comprehensive budget was developed and approved. Financials are maintained continuously, and an audit was completed, as required annually. Insurance coverages have been reviewed and renewed. All membership renewals have been processed. A remote-control staircase has been installed for the attic stairs. The Social Committee has planned an amazing, eclectic and full social season; all details are being managed. Thanks to so many who have volunteered to host events! AFSS boats are being maintained and updated as necessary. AFSS has been planned and advertised; we already have 59 children signed up, many for multiple weeks!

Thirteen new members have been inducted into the club since the first of the

year. Welcome to all of you! We look forward to seeing you on the water and on the porch and at some of our social events. On behalf of the Board and our volunteer Chairs and Committee Members, please reach out to any of us should you have any questions or concerns. We welcome you, and we celebrate your membership and participation!

Floats go in on Saturday, and we will be off to the races! I look forward to seeing everyone very soon. As always please contact me with any comments or questions.

Check Your Moorings

Do you know the underwater condition of the mooring that your pride and joy hangs on all summer? Moorings should be inspected every three years. We have a considerable amount of current in our mooring field that increases the corrosive action of electrolysis.

Contact your mooring service provider for your mooring's service history. If it's due, please schedule an inspection. This isn't just for your boat. It helps protect your neighbors too.

Are you planning to get a new or different boat this summer? If so, please notify the Waterfront and Anchorage Committee at <u>obycanchorage@gmail.com</u>. A change in boat size or configuration can alter how she lays on her mooring relative to surrounding vessels and may necessitate a relocation of the mooring.

Also, the Harpswell Harbormaster should also be advised of any vessel change. The town requires registration of all moorings, with stickers on the mooring buoy.

Play it safe to protect your vessel and the vessels around you. Let us know if you've made, or plan to make, any changes. Happy boating!
