It is also a form of community outreach since enrollment in the one and two-week sessions is open to all. Most years AFSS is the only sailing program for youth in the immediate area.

Enrollment for classes this year is down because the Club's website wasn't able to process online applications. Beginner, intermediate and racing classes still have openings for every two-week session. The second racing class, scheduled to start July 24, has been cancelled. Details for signing up during the next six weeks; are at <a href="http://www.obyc.org/afss">www.obyc.org/afss</a> where you can learn more about this year's program.

Beginners sail in the mornings when winds are light, developing the skills to sail alone in the club's Optis by the end of the week. Afternoons are for Intermediates who sail in Optis and the Rhodes 19 and the club's 420's.

School staffers include the returning Karl Kreuze and former volunteer Chloe Filipowicz as paid instructors. Four new volunteers, all of whom have attended AFSS for many years, round out this year's staff. All staff are First Aid and CPR certified, and the paid instructors have US Sailing certification. Dozens of OBYC members are active as volunteers, Sailing Committee members sign up to be monitors, usually once or twice during the 6-week program. Working from the clubhouse, they assist in whatever is needed by Erin, including staying in contact with staff via VHF radio.

Diana and Ed Kenyon and Cathy and Tom Nicholson coordinated the Pancake breakfast this year. They are taking the reins from George Kinser who had headed it up for several years.

Sailing Committee members partnered with the AFSS staff to prepare and serve the meal that included plain and blueberry pancakes, sausage, real maple syrup generously donated by Dan Stevens and Larry Barker, juice and coffee. Barbara Messamore worked her magic creating a gigantic raffle basket filled with items donated by club members.

The next fundraising event for AFSS is the Silent Auction via Zoom from 10 to 12 on Saturday, July 15. Chris and Karina Fletcher, who recently relocated to Florida, will be hosting this remotely. Look for eblasts detailing more information about auction items available, including the many gift certificates to local establishments. A Zoom link will be made available closer to the event.
