Launching Docks May 7

The Waterfront and Anchorage Committee has scheduled Wednesday May 7th for launching the club floats, attaching the runway and commissioning the waterfront for another summer of boating activity.

A small number of experienced and knowledgable members will aid a crew from Redfish Marine and the operator of the giant crane. Other members should stay clear of the club grounds on this day as the crane crew and contractors launch the floats

In preparation for the upcoming commissioning of the waterfront, a spring work party was held on Saturday, May 3rd when Committee members gathered at the club to perform general maintenance and preparatory tasks for a seamless commissioning and problem-free season on the waterfront. Committee co-chairs, Paul Cournoyer and Ed Kenyon offered "A big thanks to all of those Committee members who helped with this effort"

The chairs said that the mooring service providers are still commissioning moorings in the field. Boat owners should check that their mooring is ready before bringing a boat over.

The committee plans to apply non-skid paint to portions of the two piers that have become slippery with use — especially in rainy weather. Other dinghy and waterfront information is elsewhere in this newsletter.



Club Buys New Dinghies

The club has purchased two brand new 10' Puffin dinghies for club members to use to get to their boats. They will be outfitted with new oars and life jackets. In addition to the two 10-footers, the remaining 8' Puffin will be available, as well as a very stable West Marine Tender.

Only one of the Puffins will be available for members to sign out and leave on a mooring or use for day-trips to islands or area beaches. In total there will be four dinghies available for club member use.

For members who have their own dinghies and keep them at the club float, please ensure that that your last name and phone number is identified on the dinghy, preferably on the transom. This helps us identify a member if there's any issue with the dinghy. Dinghies must also have a club sticker.

Dinghy owners have a responsibility to make sure their dinghy is bailed of water after a rainfall. Dinghies with excess water in them add unnecessary weight on the float system and create a hazard to other nearby dinghies.

Work Party May 10!

Building & Grounds Chair Bob Seaman is seeking volunteers to help reopen the club house on Saturday, May 10 from 9 to noon.

Mooring Space Limited

The mooring field continues to be tight with limited space for new moorings. Each year, the Waterfront and Anchorage Committee reviews the field with the Harpswell Harbormaster to identify new mooring locations. OBYC does not own the mooring field, but the Waterfront and Anchorage Committee acts as stewards of the area and makes recommendations to the Harbormaster to accommodate OBYC Members' new mooring and/or mooring location change requests.

If you desire a mooring in the mooring field, please submit a request to the Waterfront and Anchorage Committee which will try to accommodate your request.

Mooring locations belong to the Town of Harpswell. As an OBYC Member, you are entitled to request a mooring location from the Town's Harbormaster. Only then can you place mooring gear in the approved location. You can sell your mooring gear to another member (or non-member, if they have separate access to Merriconeag Sound), but you cannot sell the mooring location. The new owner of your mooring gear must apply for a mooring from the Harbormaster, and the location may change per his authority. If you are no longer using your mooring, please advise the W&A Committee Co-Chairs Paul Cournoyer and Ed Kenyon at (obycanchorage@gmail.com).

The final disposition of unwanted mooring gear is the OBYC Member's responsibility. Your help with allowing your fellow club members the opportunity to obtain a place a mooring in the field is greatly appreciated.

Mooring Inspections Required by Town

Just a reminder that the Town of Harpswell Harbormaster requires mooring inspections every three years. Due to the amount of current in the club's mooring field, it's typical for mooring chains to deteriorate over just a few years. Play it safe and schedule an inspection.

Weakened chains, like the one below, can break when surface winds push a boat to the limits of its bow rope. Loose boats can damage vessels of other members and club docks as well as being damaged if
